- A set of soft pastels (artist grade quality). It's good to have a variety of colors and different values of each color. I use a variety of pastels from a harder stick to a softer stick. Some of my favorite brands include Rembrandt, Girault, Terry Ludwig, and Unison. If you are a beginner and buying soft pastels for the first time, I recommend a set of 60-90 half stick Rembrandt soft pastels. Online sets are usually cheaper at dickblick.com, amazon.com or dakotapastels.com.
- I use UArt 400 archival sanded paper. I sell 12x18 sheets for \$5 each or you can purchase online at dakotapastels.com. I prefer to use a sanded paper, but any paper that you currently use will be fine.
- Foam board for backing (Hobby Lobby or Walgreens, CVS)
- Weber's Odorless Turpenoid (blue and white container) or rubbing alcohol from your local hardware store
- An inexpensive ½" flat brush for underpainting
- Masking tape (I use 1" white artists tape)
- Paper towels
- Small sketchbook and pencils

Online art supply stores have the best deals for buying materials.

Other optional items that I like to use-

- Derwent Pencil Sketching Wallet – perfect for keeping all of your sketching supplies in one place
- The Color Wheel Company ViewCatcher Artist's View Finder
- Cottage Mills Color Evaluator II Red and Green Filter. There are other red filter options as well as red filter glasses
- A small travel set of watercolors for sketching outside. I use the Sakura Koi watercolor set
