

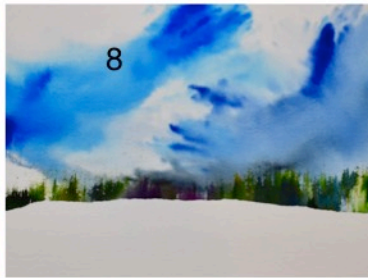
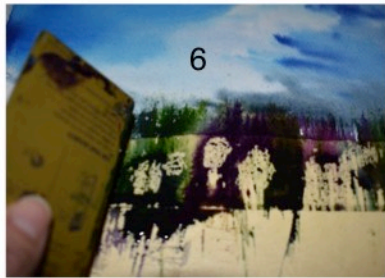
Winter Storm by Janet Nunn Watercolors
 Painting the snow is a comfort in the winter months. You look outside and see the weather changing right before your eyes.

Step 1. Tape off the snow bank in the foreground, use masking tape. Tear the edge of the tape to have a more natural edge. Step 2, 3, 4 and 5. Place a drop of Phthalo Blue, Ultramarine and Payne's Gray on a tray. Mist the paper with water. Now wad a piece of wax paper. Take the wax paper, dip it in the Phthalo Blue and onto the paper with a stroke. Now dip the wax paper into the Ultramarine and onto the paper. Last dip Payne's Gray onto the wax paper then on the paper. Let this dry.

Step 6. Using a plastic card and dip the card into paint. Now in an up and down fashion create trees at the end of the tape. Use Sap Green, Gamboge, Cobalt Violet and Ultramarine. If the paper is too dry dip the plastic card in water. Step 7. Let this dry.

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Step 8. Remove the masking tape. Step 9 and 10. Wet the foreground area with a brush. Now take the Wax paper again and this time dip in the Phthalo Blue, then across the paper. Then dip the wax paper in the Ultramarine and sweep the wax paper across the paper. Step 11. Use Bleed Proof White or Titanium White. Then with a splatter screen (Needle Point Screen), a toothbrush or a regular round brush, splatter the white for snow on the painting. The next step is up to you. You may keep the painting as is or add the birch tree. If you add the birch tree dip the plastic card into the white then press and push it on the paper to make the tree. Then dip the card into the Ultramarine and Payne's Gray and add to the tree. You might want to add a few more trees if you choose.
